What is the RE-Hive Project?

An exciting opportunity to improve the quality of the RE curriculum and teaching in your school. Like a beehive it will create a network of mutual support and excellence across your hub!

Why focus on RE?

We already have a **high quality curriculum** in South Gloucestershire that all schools access. From this we can deliver a clear **sense of intent** in RE, and build **sequential learning**. Beyond this, the teaching of RE can also bring benefits in terms of pupil's **personal, spiritual and moral development**. It opens up a space for big questions about our planet, society and the way we live.

How will the RE-Hive work?

Most **Hubs** in South Gloucestershire now have RE subject leaders **mentored** by the SACRE Adviser, Laura Harris. They have been trained to undertake '**mini RE dives**' in other schools in the hub. This will be based on a **coaching** model aimed at building the capacity of RE in **every** school in the hub.

What are the benefits to schools?

All hub schools can now access **team moderation** of the intent and implementation of the RE curriculum. In addition, all schools will benefit from **high quality resources** to improve teaching and learning in their schools. Schools will have access to **national initiatives** that will build teacher subject knowledge and confidence.

What does my school need to do?

What commitment and financial support is there for schools?

Your subject leader can access financial support for a **half day 'mini dive'** with your hub leader. The hub leader is also financially supported to take the time needed to come and work with you.
