

Food Chain Nature Trail: Grassland Habitat - You will need to visit the following control markers - numbers 6, 7, 12, 13 & 14 (please refer to the orienteering map for locations).

A food chain shows who eats what in a particular habitat. The arrows between each item in the chain always point in the direction of energy flow - in other words, from the food to the feeder. There are five living things associated with the Grassland habitat. Take a rubbing of each living thing associated with this habitat and put them in the right order below.



Food Chain Nature Trail: Woodland Habitat - You will need to visit the following control markers - numbers 4, 2, 1, 5 & 3 (please refer to the orienteering map for locations).

A food chain shows who eats what in a particular habitat. The arrows between each item in the chain always point in the direction of energy flow - in other words, from the food to the feeder. There are five living things associated with the Woodland habitat. Take a rubbing of each living thing associated with this habitat and put them in the right order below.



Food Chain Nature Trail: Orchard Habitat - You will need to visit the following control markers - numbers 21, 20 & 22 (please refer to the orienteering map for locations).

A food chain shows who eats what in a particular habitat. The arrows between each item in the chain always point in the direction of energy flow - in other words, from the food to the feeder. There are three living things associated with the Orchard habitat. Take a rubbing of each living thing associated with this habitat and put them in the right order below.



Food Chain Nature Trail: Wetland Habitat - You will need to visit the following control markers - numbers 19, 17 & 18 (please refer to the orienteering map for locations).

A food chain shows who eats what in a particular habitat. The arrows between each item in the chain always point in the direction of energy flow - in other words, from the food to the feeder. There are three living things associated with the Wetland habitat. Take a rubbing of each living thing associated with this habitat and put them in the right order below.



Food Chain Nature Trail: Hedgerow Habitat - You will need to visit the following control markers - numbers 10, 11, 9 & 8 (please refer to the orienteering map for locations).
