

Things to check before attending a vehicle fitness inspection at the Broad Lane Garage, Yate, in line with the Statement of Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy 2021

<p>All new (diesel or petrol) vehicles to be Euro 6 standard (standard commenced September 2015), and all vehicles over 5 years of age from first date of registration will not be considered for new applications. <p>Only manufactured/factory fitted privacy glass is permitted. Window tint film is not permitted and must be removed before submitting a licence application. <p>Advertising requirements must be made in writing to council providing a proof of the intended advert. <p>Are the licence plates in the correct place?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On the top sign for a hackney carriage vehicle • On the outside front and rear of the vehicle - not covering any part of the vehicle registration mark (number plate), lights or reflectors • Plates are not attached with magnets, string, wire, velcro or similar or wedged in place. <p>Has the vehicle got a fully inflated spare wheel, or run flat tyres, or in date inflation kit?
