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Welcome to the Early Years Training and Support Handbook

In this handbook you will find courses, training and information for the academic year, September 2022 – August 2023. Training is organised in **alphabetical order** to enable you to plan your training for the whole year. We hope you will find it easy to navigate and to find the type of support you would like.

There are different options available, please note the following definitions which are used throughout this handbook:

Network

A group of practitioners who come together to share, reflect and discuss an agreed focus or topic to problem solve, support and enhance their knowledge and practice.

Training

A session (or series of sessions) to enable practitioners to increase their knowledge and understanding around a particular theme to develop their practice.

Briefing

A focussed session to share new information about a particular theme.

Some sessions will be delivered in person, at the Early Years Training Room, others will be delivered virtually (over Microsoft Teams). Please note that if you attend a virtual network or training session, you will be expected to have your camera on throughout the whole session and you will be expected to contribute to discussions.

Most courses are free of charge to South Glos. delegates.

For courses that do have a charge, payment should be made through the South Gloucestershire website:

Go to the website <u>www.southglos.gov.uk</u> and click on **PAY**.

Scroll down to Other/general invoices and then select Other Payments.

You will then see an option to choose Early Years Training.

Select your course from the drop-down list and follow the instructions for payment.

Payment must be made at time of booking to secure your place. Your place will not be confirmed until payment has been made.

It is important to note that these courses are subject to a 'no-show' policy. Payments made for chargeable courses are non-refundable unless cancellation is received at least five working days prior to the start of the course. By booking on to any course directly run by the Early Years Team there is an assumption that you accept the terms and conditions of the no-show policy.


There is a charge for Bespoke / In-house training*:

The new Early Years Training Room is located within Parkwall Primary School. We no longer have access to our training room at Bradley Stoke Community School Primary Phase.

There is no on-site car parking available at Parkwall Primary School. Please park on the surrounding roads or in the public car park situated between Cadbury Heath Hall and the Co-Op (accessed off School Road – opposite the pedestrian gate into the school).

The vast majority of our readers will now be familiar with the VLE. This secure, online resource centre is available to all private, voluntary, and independent early years settings, including childminders. It is also available to all South Gloucestershire schools (including academies).

The VLE is constantly updated and should be your first point of contact for all learning and development opportunities.

The Early Years Blog

Every time we upload new information onto the VLE we include a message on the blog, so make a point of viewing it every week to keep yourself up to date with anything new.

E-learning

We offer a large selection of easy to access elearning courses. New courses are being written and added regularly and full details can be found within the <u>Learning Spaces</u> tab on the VLE.



Learning Spaces

As well as housing all our e-learning courses, in some cases we will open up a Learning Space when you attend a face-to-face training session — your tutor will tell you if your course has a Learning Space. Learning Spaces store additional information only available to those who have attended the course or are part of the research project. We have opened a Learning Space for 'VLE - How to guides' which you will automatically have access to so look and explore.

The Bristol Standard

Do you want to improve outcomes for your children?

The Bristol Standard is a unique tool that can support you to do this in a way that is bespoke to your setting.

The Bristol Standard is a self-evaluation framework that was developed in Bristol but is used by many Local Authorities across the country. It supports all Early Years settings to develop and improve the quality and effectiveness of their provision through an annual cycle of reflection.



The Bristol Standard involves a whole team approach with practitioners reflecting on what they do well and identifying developments which will improve outcomes for all children and their families. The ethos of the Bristol Standard is to 'improve on your previous best'.

The Bristol Standard Aims to:

- Provide a key tool for self-evaluation to support the development and quality of the whole setting.
- Establish a clear understanding of vision, values, principles and practice.
- Achieve high quality provision for all children from birth in a culture of inclusion and anti-discriminatory practice.
- Enable teams to work together, have a voice and learn from each other.
- Celebrate current good practice and develop the quality and effectiveness of provision through a continuous process of reflection.
- Enable settings to develop and improve the quality and effectiveness of their practice.
- Support the development of genuine partnerships with children's families or carers, other professionals and the local and wider community.
- Support a culture of shared leadership key people who motivate, sustain, challenge and empower others.
- Support a process of continuous professional development.

The Bristol Standard is based around Ten Dimensions of quality, these have been identified by research as essential to high quality provision:

Values and Aims

What do we want for all our children? How will we go about it?

Relationships and Interactions

Are we welcoming and supportive to all the people in our setting? How do we know?

The Reflective Practitioner

How do we create opportunities for children to learn through play?

The Physical Environment

How do we organise the space indoors and outside to make it welcoming, secure and stimulating?

Play and Learning Experiences

Are all the children experiencing a broad range of play and learning opportunities?

Observation, Planning and Assessment

How do we ensure we meet the needs and interests of all the children?

Leadership, Management and Staffing

How do we support staff to fulfil their role and take part in professional development?

Equality, Diversity and Inclusion

How do we include all children and ensure that we give individuals the appropriate access and support?

Partnerships with Parents and the Local Community

How do we value parents as experts on their children and make links with the community?

Monitoring and Impact

Are we doing what we aimed to do, how well is it going and what is the impact?

AET: Good Autism Practice

Target Audience

This training is suitable for any early years' practitioners working in Reception classes, Nurseries or Pre-School settings and Childminders.

Aims & Objectives

- Develop knowledge and understanding of good autism practice.
- Reflect on and improve their practice in working with autistic children.
- Understand strategies and approaches they can draw upon for autistic children they work with.
- Reflect on the kind of information they need to collect for the one-page profile, the support plan, and the EYFS profile.
- Consider how to involve the autistic child and their family in setting learning goals.

Course Description

This course is an in-depth training around identification and support focussing on the four areas of need. A basic knowledge of Autism is needed, and it is suggested



that delegates will have already completed Making Sense of Autism.

This course is delivered over 4 sessions and all sessions need to be attended to receive your course certificate. This programme and course content has been designed by the Autism Education Trust. For further information follow this link <u>Autism Education Trust</u>

Target Audience

This training is suitable for any early years' practitioners working in Reception classes, Nurseries or Pre-School settings and Childminders.

Aims & Objectives

- Enhance your understanding and awareness of Autism and how Autism can affect children in the Early Years.
- Know the importance of understanding the individual child and their profile of strengths and needs.
- Highlight potential barriers to learning for Autistic children.
- Equip you with the knowledge you need to begin to make reasonable adjustments in the way you support Autistic children.

Course Description

This course is an introduction to Autism. It is most appropriate for colleagues with little or no experience of Autism.

Dysregulation and Co-Regulation in the Outdoors

Target Audience

Early Years Practitioners working in Early Years Settings and schools.

Only 1 person per setting can attend.

Aims & Objectives

- To consider how to support children to selfregulate outdoors.
- To understand factors that affect children to be dysregulated.
- To reflect on your outdoor environment to support children's needs.





Course Description

During the course we will explore how the outdoor environment, helps children to self-regulate, through co-regulation with an emotionally available adult.

We will unpick factors that affect behaviour and dysregulation through discussion and consider strategies and approaches to support children in an outdoor environment. We will have an



opportunity to observe children playing, consider types of play, resources to support play, provocations, and continuous provision outdoors.

This is a self-reflective course that also looks at challenging the traditional way we think about behaviour management. Come prepared to be open, discuss, share thoughts, and move forward.

EYFS Assessment Network

Target Audience

This course is for teachers and teaching assistants in Reception and Nursery classes in school.
Assessment and EYFS leaders may also wish to attend.

Aims & Objectives

 To support EYFS practitioners to implement assessment systems that meet the needs of their cohort.

Course Description

The removal of age bands and the revised EYFS (with an aim of reducing paperwork) has led to many questions around the tracking of progress and assessment processes in EYFS.

This network will support participants to:

- ensure their assessment systems are robust and meet the statutory requirements for assessment.
- Use assessment information to identify next steps in learning.
- analyse data and discuss methods of assessment to develop good practice and improve provision in early years.
- ensure provision is meeting the needs of all learners.

We will also address current concerns and challenges that arise throughout the year and keep you informed of local and national initiatives and opportunities. There will be a theme for each session and there will also be time for questions. We would like this training to be responsive to the needs of those attending, so please bring along your ideas and suggestions.

EYFS for Subject Leaders

Target Audience

This network is for all Subject Leaders in South Gloucestershire Primary Schools.

Aims & Objectives

- To increase your understanding of the EYFS and programmes of study.
- To make links with your national curriculum subject and area of learning in EYFS.
- To develop your knowledge and understanding of EYFS pedagogy.
- To know how to evaluate your subject in EYFS.

Course Description

This one-part course will explore the EYFS, delving into high-quality practice and provision in supporting all seven areas of learning.

Subject leaders will be able to make links with their subjects and develop their knowledge around the types of provision



and experiences children will have in EYFS that will develop their foundational knowledge and skills.

There will be opportunity to look in greater depth at your subject and to question and discuss in small groups.

Subject leaders will increase their understanding of what to look for in an EYFS class and what effective provision is like in practice.

Aims & Objectives

- To explore and agree assessment information for children at the midpoint of their Reception year.
- To explore 'expected progress' in the EYFS.

Course Description

The Early Years Team will facilitate this session where schools can come together and discuss their judgements around children's levels of development and attainment at the mid-point of the Reception year.

The Early Learning Goals (ELGs) will be unpicked in detail and we will consider how areas interlink and the importance of a holistic approach to making judgements.

The session will focus on professional discussion and there is no expectation to bring along any evidence, although schools are welcome to do so and this can support conversations.

This will be an informal session to unpick assessment information and to ask questions and have discussions with members of the Early Years team as well as collegues from other schools.

The sessions will focus on professional discussion and there is no expectation to bring along any evidence, although schools are welcome to do so and this can support conversations.

Floorbooks Network

Target Audience

This network is for all Teachers who are working within Reception classes or **Nursery Classes in South** Gloucestershire Schools.

Aims & Objectives

- To develop the use of Floorbooks to capture learning and development across an area or areas of learning.
- To understand how Floorbooks can support planning, provision and assessment.
- To use Floorbooks as a way of embedding and extending learning.

Course Description

This network will support the development of a Floorbook approach to capture children's learning and development over time.

You may already be using Floorbooks and would like some further support, or this may be new to you this year. Wherever you are on your Floorbook journey, you are welcome to attend.

We will explore why you might use a Floorbook and the benefits of documenting learning in this way. Participants will meet to share their Floorbooks and discuss how they are being used within the classroom. There will be opportunities to meet with like-minded colleagues and share successes and problem solve together.

If you are interested in undertaking action research linked to Floorbooks, this can also be facilitated during these meetings but will not be an expectation.

From Fire Lighting to Literacy

Target Audience

Early Years Practitioners working in Early Years Settings and Reception staff

Only 1 person per setting can attend

Aims & Objectives

- To understand and explore the HSE approach to risk benefit analysis.
- To consider the benefits of for children's learning and development and how these STEM experiences can be used in your setting.
- Use the natural elements in nature to support literacy.





Course Description

Learn the elements of fire to make charcoal. Whittle and make your own pencil and write with, as an inspirational process to stimulate learning.

Fire is evolutionary. Evidence indicates that our ancestors began using fire one million years ago and were using it



regularly by 400,000 BC. It provided light, warmth, and it was also a weapon against major predators, most importantly it enabled us to cook many have theorised that there is a vital connection between cooking and the human brain. ending the day around the campfire, where songs, stories and relationships blossomed, ultimately shaped cultures and perhaps even helped develop some of our ability to understand one another, cooperate and internalize culture.

Evidence of charcoal making goes back to almost the start of human history. Charcoal making and burning have been a staple of the British countryside for thousands of years, there are many uses for charcoal today and none better than writing or drawing with.

This is a practical course, and we will be outside whatever the weather so dress accordingly

Inspiring Writing in EYFS

Target Audience

This course is aimed at all Early Years Practitioners working in Reception Classes in school (teachers and teaching assistants).

Aims & Objectives

- To provide delegates with the skills and inspiration to improve writing outcomes for all children in EYFS, especially boys through high quality teaching and learning opportunities.
- To consider the importance of the environment in stimulating children's play experiences and to motivate them to write.

Course Description

Would you like to provide exciting and inspiring story telling opportunities for your children that will ignite their imagination and motivation for writing?



This practical course will enable you to discover how the use of small world play, drama and props, within your environment can complement focused teaching to empower children to

write.

We will look at the processes involved in the teaching of writing, alongside the essential experiences needed to enable all children to see themselves as writers.

You will have the opportunity to audit your environment ('What gender is your classroom?') and use this information to provide provocations which support all learners to develop and succeed.

Level 2 Award in Curriculum Based Outdoor Learning Practice (QCF) 5 Credits

Target Audience

This two-and-a-half-day course is aimed at anyone with an educational background wanting to develop outdoor teaching skills.

School and Early Year's setting practitioners are welcome.

Aims & Objectives

- To identify the learning opportunities outside and plan a programme of outdoor learning sessions.
- To develop a risk/benefit analysis for outdoor learning.
- To understand ecology and the sustainable use of natural resources in the outdoor environment.

We all know the outdoors is important but how can we really develop this in our schools and settings?


Do you want confident, capable, interested, motivated, inspired, resilient, creative, respectful children to achieve and become *lifelong learners?*

Would you like more confidence or ideas to develop the curriculum outdoors?

If so, this is the course for you!

Course Description

This training will enable you to build confidence and your ability in using the outdoor environments, learning how to manage and improve these for teaching & learning. It is designed to be a practical, accessible, and supportive training building a bank of useful ideas, in helping you to make a success of implementing curriculum based outdoor Learning.







What next? Once this course is completed, if you would like to develop your knowledge and work towards embedding outdoor learning as a whole school/setting strategy, you can top up and book onto Level 3 Award in Coordinating an Outdoor Curriculum.

Level 3 Certificate in Leading Forest School (QCF) 19 credits

Target Audience

This eight-day course is designed for those who would like to develop, set up and deliver Forest School programmes.

This will enable leadership of Forest School Programmes linked to child development.

Entry requirements:

All delegates must be over 18, have a relevant Level 2 qualification, a current DBS check, an appropriate First Aid qualification and an established link with a client group and Forest School site.

Aims & Objectives

- Understanding the development of Forest School and put the Forest School principals and ethos into practice.
- Understand the coordination required for the Forest School Programme.
- Be able to confidently deliver Forest School sessions and reflect on practice.

Course Description

Level 3 Certificate in Leading Forest School (QCF) 19 credits This course is designed for those who would like to develop, set up and deliver Forest School programmes. This will enable leadership of Forest School programmes linked to child development. Through a combination of practical outdoor learning



and indoor teaching, you will explore the benefits for children as child led learners for lifelong skills. This will enable you to deepen your knowledge and understanding, looking at the philosophy and ethos begin the Forest School approach.

- 6 face-to-face training sessions.
- 2 skill assessment days and complete a portfolio of work.
- Tutorial of support.
- In person practical work-based assessment.
- Access to South Glos Skills Share Network and ongoing support.
- Access to Cambium Sustainable support Moodle with huge amounts of resources and information.
- 2 knowledgeable trainers

Through a combination of practical outdoor learning and indoor teaching, we will explore the benefits for children as child led learners for lifelong skills. This will enable you to deepen your knowledge and understanding of the philosophy and the ethos behind the Forest School approach.

This course includes six days of face-to-face training which includes: the theory of play; co-ordination and delivery of Forest School programme; holistic development; impact of Forest School on behaviour; emotional intelligence; play and development; observation and assessment; risk benefit and management; fires; tool use and cooking.

The course also involves two days of face-toface skills assessment.

Learners must complete a portfolio of work for assessment. The course equates to 70 hours of taught time and requires, on average, a further 120 hours of self-study time from the student.



Portage Workshop A 'Small Steps to Learning' Approach

Target Audience

This course is aimed at professionals working with early years children with SEND i.e., childminders, Early Years practitioners, teachers, LSAs.
