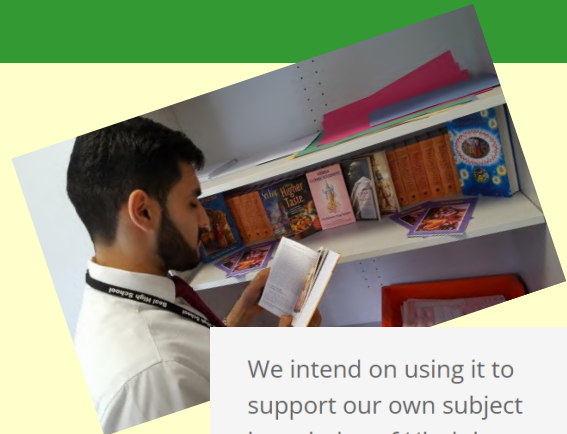


## The Gita Project
