As Group Lead on this committee I am responsible for briefing my fellow Group members on the key issues that the committee has to deal with, and for meeting with other Lead Members at Draft Agenda meetings to agree the business for future meetings. I take part in the regular Taxi Liaison Group meetings and have attended external conferences on licensing matters. To better understand issues raised concerning the Licensing Service, I have visited the Licensing Office and attended a demonstration of Wheelchair Access vehicles

Key Milestones/Achievements during the reporting Period

Approval of the policy on wheelchair access vehicles and a review of our licensing policy as it impacts community groups. Served on a number of licensing sub-committees and attempted to streamline the procedures for assessing whether an applicant can be deemed to be a 'fit and proper person' to hold a Hackney Carriage/PHV licence.

What "added value" to the local community have you been able to achieve through your special responsibilities?

The extra participation in licensing matters and additional contact with users of the service have enabled me to develop a deeper understanding of the issues that impact on the safety of our residents and that fall within the remit of the Council's licensing team. This has meant I understand some of areas of licensing where there is a gap between residents' expectations and what is possible in relation to national legislation or local practice.

As explained above, I have had the opportunity to improve my knowledge and understanding of licensing which will help the Council formulate, agree and implement effective policies.
