

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR CRIME AND POLICING ACT 2014

SECTION 59 - PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER

South Gloucestershire (Northcote Road) Public Space Protection Order 2023

SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNCIL (the Council) in exercise of its powers under section 59 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014 (the Act), being satisfied that the anti-social behaviour arising from the dismantling, repair and storage of unroadworthy vehicles, has or will have a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality, makes the following order:

1. A person may not park or store, or allow to be parked or stored, vehicles that are in an unroadworthy condition on the land to which this Order applies. Vehicles must be taxed, have a valid MOT, and be insured, unless exempt.
2. A person may not undertake, or allow, the dismantling of, or repairs to vehicles within the land to which this Order applies. This provision does not apply to routine maintenance tasks to roadworthy vehicles such as checking tyre pressure or fluid levels.
3. A person may not park or store, or allow to be parked or stored, vehicles used or adapted for the transport of other vehicles, on land to which this Order applies.
4. This Order applies to land within the district of South Gloucestershire which is to the rear of Northcote Road, Rodway Road and Long Road, as shown on the attached plan.
5. Any person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with the requirements of this Order commits an offence and shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding Level 3 on the standard scale.
6. A Fixed Penalty Notice may be issued to a person who a constable or authorised person has reason to believe has committed an offence under this order. Payment of the Fixed Penalty discharges any liability to conviction for the offence.
7. An interested person may apply to the High Court to question the validity of this Order, within a period of 6 weeks beginning from the date on which the Order is made.
8. The Order shall come into operation on 1st July 2023 and shall remain in place for a period of 3 years.
