There is a charge to borrow DVDs.



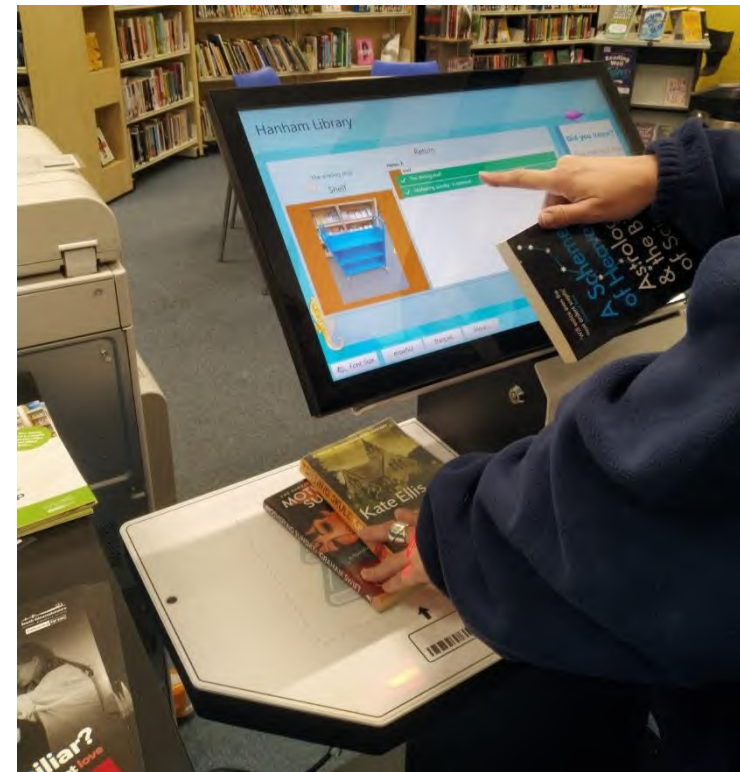
## When we visit the library

Chatterbooks Reading Group

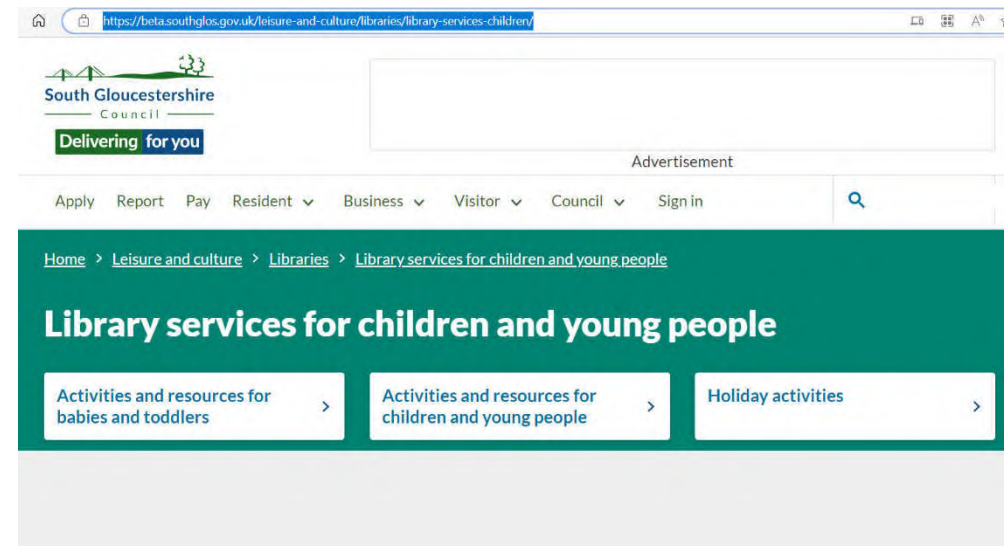
The library can be a little noisier and it can be busier during these fun activities.




## When we visit the library
