STEP 1: Register by **30 April** and get your free packets of lettuce seeds! (up to 5 packets of organic lettuce seeds)

To take part, you need to grow some lettuces. There are two other optional categories you can enter: most plentiful vegetable patch and most wonky vegetable.

From planting the seeds to munching on the yummy lettuce takes about 6 weeks. Here's how you do it ➡

HOW YOU GROW IT:

LETTUCE



TIP: There are many varieties of lettuce, try growing little gem lettuce, they're quick to grow and small in size.

STEP 2: Take a photo of your growing patch or space before you plant your seeds and email it to: Climate.Emergency@southglos.gov.uk by **30 April**.

STEP 3: Grow your plants! Make sure to water them and give them lots of love, rhs.org.uk offer tips on growing for beginners.

STEP 4: Ready to harvest? Simply take and submit a photo of your plants and count your lettuces (before you wash them and start munching on them!).

We will send an email reminder on **1 June** and then you will have until **30 June** to send in the photo/s of your plants.

COMPETITION ENTRIES:

1. Most lettuces grown successfully in school (email before and after photos and the number of lettuces grown)
2. Most plentiful vegetable patch (email before and after photos)
3. Most wonky vegetable (email photo/s).

Entries will be judged using the photos of the lettuces submitted and winners will be asked to agree to have a short film taken showing their lettuces/vegetable patch.
